### 9. Assessment Criteria Explained

Clubs spend thousands of euro annually on dealing with waste, water and energy. This project aims to reduce costs and waste volumes, water use and energy use.

#### 1. Participation

Maximum involvement and participation is necessary in order for targets to be achieved. Ensure that the planned involvement of partners/ participants/ leaders is documented in the Application Form.

#### 2. Project Ideas: Below is a list of suggested projects:

Clubs may select one initiative –up to a maximum of three. Clubs that choose just one initiative may not necessarily score fewer points.

- 1. Elimination of single-use plastics at training, games, camps, club shops, coffee shops, coffee docks etc.
- 2. Re-usable cup campaign beverages
- 3. Setting up of a refill point for water bottles (visit <u>www.refill.ie</u>)
- 4. Green Travel initiative travel to club grounds
- 5. Introduce a waste management system
- 6. Introduce a returnable boots scheme
- 7. Reducing Energy (especially lights on during Winter)
- 8. Run an 'Action Day' including a' take-home' message (e.g. stop food waste, bicycleswap scheme, bicycle maintenance workshop, plastics, polyester clothing)
- 9. Reduction of water use sinks, urinals, pitch,
- 10. Create a club slogan with a green theme that can be used in club communications.
- 11. Run a kids poster competition for environmental awareness

The aim of this project is to highlight the issue of waste and consumption and to address it by means of prevention. <u>Projects must favour 'Waste Prevention' over Recycling and Reduction</u>.

#### 3. Awareness raising potential

It is hoped that the clubs as a result of this project will reduce waste, water use and energy use, thereby become more efficient and save money. Include information about how you plan to share this story with your community.

#### 4. Project Term

Total project should be completed within <u>7 months</u> of the receipt of initial grant. <u>Projects</u> which plan for longevity will be given a higher score.

#### 5. Widely replicable

<u>Proposals demonstrating good management to achieve feasible objectives will be given a higher score.</u>

#### 7. Project Team

Successful Applicants should <u>create a team</u> to work on the proposed measures.

#### 8. Project Scoring

Submitted applications will be scored as shown in section headings up to a maximum score of 140 points.

All Applications should be submitted before the deadline. Late applications will automatically disqualify.

### 10. General Rules

**Please do not submit any utility bills with this initial application.** Copies of utility bills may be requested from the winning applicants.

- 1. Winning clubs will receive funding of €1,000 and a further €1,000 when measures have been implemented -subject to council approval.
- 2. Mentoring will be available to the winning clubs to increase project performance.
- 3. An Implementation Report shall be submitted by the club following the 7 month term of this project. It will include tangible figures of waste Prevention/ Reduction achieved and photos of the Action Day/ camps which Fingal Co Council can use in media and publications.
- 4. Only one application per club is allowed.
- 5. Tax Clearance: Applicants should be advised that approval of funding will be conditional on tax clearance requirements being met.
- 6. Applicants must ensure that relevant projects are carried out in accordance with all child protection policies and procedures.
- 7. Applicants may be subject to Garda vetting procedures.
- 8. Commercial/business projects are not eligible for funding.
- 9. Fingal County Council reserves the right to refuse grant funding.
