Healthy Age Friendly Homes at Pobal30 Event.



Francis Kane, Healthy Age Friendly Homes Coordinator for Galway City and County recently attended the Pobal30 event to mark the 30th anniversary of Pobal, this is one of a series of events taking place nationwide to highlight the progress made in last three decades in the areas of social inclusion, equality, and community development.




Pobal works on behalf of Government to support communities and local agencies toward achieving social inclusion and development. The role of Pobal is to provide management and support services to 41 programmes, schemes and services in the areas of Social Inclusion and Equality, Inclusive Employment and Enterprise, and Early Years and Young People. Pobal work in the areas of social inclusion, early childhood care and education, community development, peace and reconciliation, equality, labour market supports and education and training. Some of the groups supported by Government through Pobal include the long term unemployed, young people, farmers / fishermen, families, Travellers, older people and ex-prisoners. Their work ranges from programme design to implementation support to financial administration and governance of funding allocations. Pobal promote quality enhancement amongst local community-based groups, develop programme and system management tools and work to ensure funded projects work within agreed guidelines. Pobal also provide good practice case studies, evaluations, and demographic

information that support Government Departments in making policy decisions. Tools such as Pobal Maps and the Pobal HP Deprivation Index are made freely available to allow policy makers and communities respond to needs identified by these sets of tools.

Pobal works on an all-island basis, with offices in Dublin, Monaghan, Sligo, Clifden, Letterkenny, Cork, Galway city, Limerick, Mullingar and Kilkenny, employing over 700 staff. The event was attended by representatives from across the community and voluntary sector and featured a panel discussion on enhancing social inclusion, and a keynote address from Minister Joe O'Brien, Minister of State at the











Department of Rural and Community Development with special responsibility for Community Development and Charities.

The event was also attended by Councillor Eddie Hoare, Mayor of Galway City. Francis had the opportunity to outline to both Minister O'Brien and Mayor Hoare the progress made by the Healthy Age Friendly Homes Programme and the scaling up of the programme across the country. Francis also discussed the housing needs of older people in Galway with Karen Golden, CEO of Galway Simon, who provide support and assistance to people across Galway in the areas of homelessness and housing.



Age Friendly Ireland were also represented at the event by Theresa Donohue, Age Friendly Ireland Programme Manager for Galway City. It was fitting to have the event in the Ardilaun Hotel in Galway, which as a member of the Select Hotels of Ireland is an Age Friendly Business accredited hotel.

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

This large-scale project worked across 14 European countries with over 300 staff contributing to it.


In this final dialogue workshop, we share our approach and some of the outcomes; and we invite leading contributors from civil society, researchers and practitioners to share their impressions and their views with us.















The event also garnered national media coverage. The ASI called for funding for Dementia Specific Day Services, Therapeutic Support and Education for Family Carers; Dementia Home Care, Dementia Nurse Specialists, Memory Clinics and Research as well as investment to secure Pay Parity for workers in The ASI and Social Protection for Dementia Carers.

The PBS took place following months of robust consultation with stakeholders, including people with dementia and those who support them, The ASI team including Operations, Dementia Advisors, the Senior Management Team, the Irish Dementia Working Group and the Dementia Carers Campaign Network. The ExWell Health Fair

HSE Social and Therapeutic Horticulture Project



"I love gardening and sowing seeds - this took me back to long summer days in my own garden with my children. The smells, the feel of the leaves, it was just lovely to get to be a part of that again," according to a nursing home resident talking about a HSE horticultural therapy project. "The garden club made me feel like I was a part of something a bit different than the normal activities we do. It was nice to do it all together in a group. It provided a lovely sense of calm and peace and I would just love to do it again".

The four-week social and therapeutic horticulture project was piloted across 5 HSE Community Healthcare East sites in 2022 (Dalkey Community Unit for Older Persons, St Colman's Residential Care Centre, Clonskeagh Community Nursing Unit, Hawthorns (disability service) and Carew House). The programme was run by Health Promotion and Improvement Officer Fiona Brauneisen and Therapeutic Horticulture









	Practitioner Marie Hirst and its success led to its continuation and expansion this year. Fiona explained that social and therapeutic horticulture is a "therapeutic practice used to improve health and wellbeing through actively involving patients and clients in caring for plants. Activities are facilitated by a therapeutic horticulture practitioner, or other professionals such as occupational therapists with appropriate training. It includes propagating plants, identifying and planting seeds and using plants in crafting. "The aim of the programme is to increase the wellbeing of participants across all sites post-Covid through caring and working with plants. More specifically, the programme seeks to increase social inclusion, physical activity and self-care. We also set out to decrease stress and loneliness amongst service users and residents. A different theme is covered each week. The themes include activities that allow participants to appreciate nature, learning how to propagate plants and create a planter. After each session there is a product that each participant can keep and according to those involved, this added to a sense of ownership and purpose. The main impact reported in the project evaluation was an increase in social inclusion and wellbeing."






