Third Private Rightsizing Scheme announced by Limerick City and County Council

The local authority has a new scheme where homeowners older than 55 who find their dwellings too large for them, may request the council to purchase their home in return for a life-long tenancy in a managed Older Persons Scheme.



The Private Rightsizing scheme is entirely voluntary and in partnership with Clann, a division of Clúid Housing that provides dedicated age-friendly homes for people 55 years and older. This exciting new scheme is located at Woodfield Manor, Newcastle West and includes two-bed bungalows. It will be available from October 2023.

Both the Council and Clann are working together to deliver more age-friendly housing to Limerick residents, planning to ensure the right housing options and supports are in place as our population ages, reducing the likelihood of entering into nursing homes or care facilities.

The closing date for receipt of applications from eligible candidates over the age of 55 is the 8th September 2023 at 5pm.

Candidates who submit a full application with supporting documentation will be assessed to ensure they meet the eligibility requirements. Limerick City and County Council will hold a panel of approved candidates in excess of the number of available properties in case a selected candidate's circumstances change and are unable to accept the offer.

	Minister for Health announces 215,000 people are newly eligible for	
	free GP care from today.	
	Minister for Health, Stephen Donnelly today announced the opening of applications for GP visit cards for up to 215,000 people who are newly eligible. This is the first of two phases which will provide free GP care to an estimated 430,000 people in Ireland on a means tested basis. It is part of the biggest expansion in eligibility for free GP care in the history of the state happening this year and covering up to 500,000 people. These changes apply to adults and children aged 8 to 69 . All children aged under 8 and people aged 70 and over are automatically eligible for a GP visit card.

Avondale House Welcomes Older People's Councils

Age Friendly WICKLOW Members of the County Wicklow Older People's Council (OPC) took part in a guided tour of Avondale House on Tuesday last (Sept 12) to assess the accessibility of the venue and the experience for older people.

The newly refurbished Avondale House is an added attraction for visitors to Avondale Forest Park, in addition to the Beyond the Trees Walkway and Viewing Tower. Officially opened last June, guided tours are available for visitors which will take them through the home of Samuel Hayes, its first owner; the Parnell family who inhabited the house in the 1800s and the forestry school which was subsequently set up in the house once it was acquired by the state in 1904.

The OPC is a representative group of older people, established by Wicklow County Council as part of the national Age Friendly Programme. The key purpose is to provide the authentic voice of older people in the county, representing the diversity that exists among our ageing population. The walkability audit at Avondale House was co-ordinated by Alice Corbett, Age Friendly Ireland Regional Manager and Clodagh Whelan, Age Friendly Programme Manager for County Wicklow.

Carina Holmes, Chairperson of the County Wicklow Older People's Council, said: "It was a great pleasure to visit Avondale House and the experience was enhanced by the knowledge of the tour guide, who made the history of the house and the families who lived there very real and accessible to all."

Katherine Webster, Avondale Operations Manager, stated that "Coillte are committed to ensuring that all its operations at Avondale are accessible to all. We also have two wheelchairs available for visitors to borrow, on request, if you feel that your legs need a rest at any stage of the one-hour guided tour of Avondale House."

Overall feedback on the venue and the experience for older people was very positive and detailed feedback will be sent to Coillte operations team.

The Cathaoirleach of Wicklow County Council, Cllr Aoife Flynn Kennedy, commended Coillte on their commitment to seeking feedback from older people. "*It is essential that this very large demographic group be heard and that their needs are met. As our aging population is projected to increase, with people living longer into the future, we want to ensure that Wicklow a great place to grow older for all,*" she stated.

Beyond The Trees Avondale was certified as the first Age Friendly Tourist Destination in Ireland last year by Age Friendly Ireland while the innovative visitor destination has also been shortlisted for the National Age Friendly Recognition and Achievement Awards 2023, under the Business Innovation Category. Emer O'Gorman, Chief Executive, Wicklow County Council, also offered her congratulations to Coillte on being shortlisted for the National Awards, saying:" It will be a great opportunity for you to showcase the fantastic work you've put in to making this such a successful initiative."
