# Minister for Mental Health and Older People marks World Alzheimer's Day 2023





Minister for Mental Health and Older People Mary Butler TD marked World Alzheimer's Day 21<sup>st</sup> September by announcing the recruitment of over 160 staff to support the development of new Memory Services across Ireland for Alzheimer's disease and other dementias.

Ten new Memory Assessment and Support Services are being established in Mayo, Sligo, Waterford, Wexford, Cavan/Monaghan, Donegal, Kerry,

Limerick, Mullingar and Galway. In each location, multidisciplinary teams consisting of medical, nursing and therapy staff will undertake up to 300 new assessments per year and serve a population of up to 150,000 people.



# **World Alzheimer's Month**



This World Alzheimer's Month (WAM), the Dementia: Understand Together campaign is encouraging people and organisations to take simple actions to help raise awareness of dementia and the things we can do to improve and maintain our brain health.

The theme for WAM this year is "Never too early, never too late" with a focus on risk factors and risk reduction.

With the number of people living with dementia set to more than double by 2045, it has never been more important to recognise the risk factors associated with dementia and take proactive steps towards risk reduction. Through promoting brain health we hope to emphasise how by keeping our brain healthy we can delay and potentially prevent the onset of dementia, and encourage greater wellbeing for those with a diagnosis.

Hosted by Eamon Keogh, the episode includes new ideas on how to achieve a balanced diet for children. Marian shares her professional and personal experiences about the most effective ways to introduce new foods into a child's diet. She explains why it is important to support kids at a young age to develop a healthy relationship with food and what that means.

She also talks about how parents should give themselves a break and while it may not work the first time, she encourages parent's to keep trying to introduce those healthier options into meal times and into lunchboxes. # Assisted Decision-Making Act, Public Awareness 'BOOSTER' Campaign, September 2023











Safeguarding Ireland has launched a two-week public awareness campaign to promote greater public understanding and application of the Assisted Decision-making Capacity Act, which came into effect in April.

The law or Act is one of the most significant new bodies of social legislation in Ireland for many years and is designed to uphold people's rights, particularly among vulnerable adults.

Safeguarding Ireland Chairperson Patricia Rickard-Clarke encouraged every person, professional and organisation to make the effort to become familiar with the law – and importantly to now apply it.

"The new law is about rights and taking every possible step to assist people to continue making their own decisions about their health, finances, housing, work or personal welfare – even if there are challenges in doing so due to capacity. "It is of particular importance for people who have challenges with decision-making such as those living with frailty, dementia, an intellectual disability, an acquired brain injury, or mental illness. But it may be important to all of us at certain times in our lives."

Also included in the law is guidance for doctors, lawyers and financial providers such as banks on actions they must take to uphold the rights of all people to decision-making.

To coordinate this major change, a new State Agency called the Decision Support Service (DSS) has been established and is responsible for promoting public awareness, to register the new decision support arrangements, to provide oversight and to resolve issues which arise.
