- Class suitability is only a guide.






Clann Lir

Fantastic Mr Fox





Patrick has been desperate for a dog of his own for as long as he can remember – and this summer, with his father away, he longs for a buddy more than ever.



The Twits






When the school caretaker mysteriously disappears, leaving behind a small pile of sand, Max is drawn into an extraordinary adventure.
