
Teachers - How it Works:

- Class suitability is only a guide.






Mo Willems I Broke My Trunk!


Alexander McCall Smith Good Dog Lion



The four children of King Lir are happy when their father marries again. Aoife, their new stepmother is very kind to them. But in her heart she is jealous of the children.






Anne Holm I Am David




Roald Dahl Boy: Tales of Childhood


Lemony Snicket The Bad Beginning


David Walliams The Midnight Gang


Jacqueline Wilson *Cookie*




Ross Montgomery Max and the Millions

Max is used to spending time alone - it's difficult to make friends in a big, chaotic school when you're deaf. He prefers to give his attention to the little things in life.




Marita Conlon-McKenna *Under the Hawthorn Tree*



Anne Frank The Diary of a Young Girl (abridged)




John Boyne The Boy in the Striped **Pyjamas**


Patricia Murphy Ava's Diary


Alan Early Arthur Quinn and the World Serpent


Willy Russell **Blood Brothers**
